## Criteria for Honor Roll in Grades 6, 7, and 8:

- \*\*A student must have a grade of at least 85 in each of the academic subjects.
   Academic Subjects included are:
   Religion, English, Reading/Literature, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies
- A student must have a grade of at least 80 in each of the special subjects.

  Special Subjects included are: Art, Music, Physical Education/Health, World Language and Computer Special Note: Special subjects are not added into the cumulative grade.
- They must also demonstrate Christian Values.
  - \*A cumulative average will be calculated utilizing the academic subject grades.

### Honors for Grades 6, 7, and 8 the range is as follows:

- High Honors with Distinction  $\sim 95-100$ 
  - High Honors  $\sim 90-94$ 
    - Honors ~ 85~89

# Criteria for Certificate of Achievement for Grades 4 and 5: the range is as follows:

To qualify for a Certificate of Achievement:

- A student must have a **cumulative grade point average between 85-100** in their academic subjects with a minimum grade of **at least 85 in each.**
- A student must have a grade of at least 80 in each of the special subjects.
- They must also demonstrate Christian Values with no areas of concern noted.

\*\*NJHS Eligibility Requirements: A student must meet the criteria for Honor Roll as well as, achieve a minimum of a cumulative grade of 90% or above.
