LUNCH - Lunch is \$3.60/per day. Many children are coming to school without lunch money! Please remember lunch money is due the day your child orders. You can pay in advance if you want and can pay with check or cash.

DRESS DOWN DAY POLICY/MONTHLY PASSES ~ Each month throughout the school year, beginning in October, St. Rocco School will be offering special dress down passes for the month. You may purchase the monthly passes for December for the cost of \$5.00. The "Dress Down Day" passes are for Mondays only (If your child is scheduled for gym class on Monday, the dress down pass is for Tuesday only). Please place the money in a clearly labeled envelope with the required form with your child's name, grade, along with your payment. (Checks ONLY) Passes will NO LONGER be sent home. Teachers and the office will keep track of who paid for Monthly Dress Down. This is a more streamlined way to offer Dress Down Days as well as us saving paper! 

Classroom News

Fourth Grade News ~ Mrs. Ciunci's Class

The first couple of months in fourth grade at St. Rocco School have been bustling with activity! The students have settled in wonderfully and are working diligently across all subjects.

In English, they have crafted personal narratives about special memories, choosing topics such as a ride on the Tower of Terror, the first day of fourth grade, days at amusement parks, birthday parties, new pets, visits to the science museum, beach outings, and trips to Florida. These narratives have allowed us to focus on small moments and incorporate sensory details, making the stories engaging and immersive. Sharing these stories has fostered a sense of community and sparked a lot of laughter. Additionally, students wrote descriptive paragraphs about their unique pumpkin designs. This fun exercise involved a classmate attempting to illustrate the pumpkin based solely on the description, highlighting the importance of descriptive details in writing.






Our reading curriculum is both exciting and challenging. We're exploring the question, "How can a place affect how we live?" through various literary works, including biographies, autobiographies, magazine articles, and informational texts. Students are developing their skills in making predictions, utilizing background knowledge, drawing inferences, and analyzing text structures.

In science and social studies, students are expanding their knowledge by studying cells, plants, animals, habitats, maps, and geography. They've even created their own islands and are currently learning about Rhode Island.

In math, we're focusing on computation, estimation, counting money, making change, problem-solving, and mastering multiplication facts. Students are enhancing their skills using Chromebooks for typing practice, math exercises, and reading comprehension, utilizing platforms like Typing Club, Nitro Type, Blooket, and Boddle, as



Our religion lessons emphasize the importance of thinking before acting and treating others as we wish to be treated. We've learned that God reveals Himself through Jesus and that we are called to show love and compassion to all, just as He did. Students understand that their faith can grow through prayer, and that the saints are always interceding for us.

New this year, the fourth grade has had the privilege of working with students from Providence College every Tuesday in Math. These small group sessions have greatly

enhanced our lessons, and both the college students and our fourth graders genuinely love this time together.




Fourth grade is such an exciting year filled with bright, creative students. It is truly a blessing to witness their academic and spiritual growth!
