Friendly Reminders

DRESS DOWN DAY POLICY/MONTHLY PASSES ~ Each month throughout the school year, beginning in October, St. Rocco School will be offering special dress down passes for the month. You may purchase the monthly passes for November for the cost of \$5.00. The "Dress Down Day" passes are for Mondays only (If your child is scheduled for gym class on Monday, the dress down pass is for Tuesday only). Please place the money in a clearly labeled envelope with the required form with your child's name, grade, along with your payment. (Checks ONLY) Passes will NO LONGER be sent home. Grade 1 – Miss Messier

Hello from 1st grade!

We have been so busy these first 2 months of school. We are settled into our new routine and are loving being big 1st graders! Each day we become more and more independent with our writing! We have been working hard on sounding out words and remembering all our rules when writing a sentence.



In Reading, we are working on reading and spelling short vowel words. This week, we are working with the short "o" sound. Each week we read 2 stories in our reading textbooks. We love being able to read stories all on our own! Even though we love being able to read on our own now, one of our favorite parts of the day is when Miss Messier reads us a story using Novel Effect. As Miss Messier reads, the story comes to life with music and sound! Some of our favorite fall stories have been Creepy Carrots, Room on the Broom, and The Good, The Bad, and The Spooky. Another thing we love to do during our reading block is literacy centers. We use magnifying glasses to find hidden word wall words and play

Feast of St. Anthony Gianelli

On Wednesday, October 23rd, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Anthony Gianelli the founder of The Daughters of Our Lady of the Garden Mass is at 8:45 am in St. Rocco's Church

Anthony Maria Gianelli was born in 1789 into a middle-class family living near Genoa in the north of Italy. As a child, people were often struck by his gentle nature, industriousness, and extraordinary intelligence. When he came of age, the lady who owned the farm his family lived on became his generous benefactress and financed his schooling and entry into the ecclesiastical seminary in Genoa. The Sisters of Our Lady of the Garden were founded in 1829 and dedicated their lives to teaching poor children and caring for the ill and infirm. They are still active and well known today in Italy and in other parts of the world as well. Anthony Gianelli was canonized in 1951 by Pope Pius XII.
